Remember, remember

- On Bonfire Night it is illegal to set off fireworks after midnight.
- It is illegal to throw fireworks.
- Police have the power to stop and search anyone suspected of carrying fireworks.
- Fireworks can scare people, particularly the elderly, it can also frighten animals.
- · It is illegal to sell fireworks to under 18's.
- You could be fined up to £5,000 or issued a £90 Fixed Penalty Notice for the misuse of fireworks.

Look at the safety tips below for Bonfire Night.

Use these tips to help you create your own informative poster on how to stay safe on Bonfire Night.

Keep your pets indoors on Bonfire Night, as they might try to run away if they get scared.



Always make sure you stay with a grown up on Bonfire Night.



Stay well back from bonfires and fireworks.



Keep fireworks in a closed box.



Make sure you are wearing gloves when you hold a sparkler.



Hold sparklers at arm's length and away from you and other people.



Put out sparklers in a bucket of water.



No one should ever return to a lit firework, even if it hasn't gone off.



Only adults should ever light fireworks or a bonfire.

DON'T BUILD A Bonfire too high

ALWAYS ENSURE YOUR FIRE IS BUILT IN AN OPEN SPACE AND NOT TOO CLOSE TO HOUSES, HEDGES, FENCES OR SHEDS. WHERE POSSIBLE, TRY TO ATTEND AN ORGANISED DISPLAY AND KEEP A SAFE DISTANCE TO ENSURE YOUR SAFETY.



KEEP A BUCKET OF WATER NEARRY

ENSURE YOU HAVE A HOSEPIPE OR BUCKET OF WATER ON HAND IN CASE OF AN EMERGENCY. USED FIREWORKS AND SPARKLERS SHOULD ALWAYS BE PLACED INTO THE BUCKET AFTER USE FOR SAFETY.



ALWAYS FOLLOW THE INSTRUCTIONS

AND REMEMBER TO USE A TORCH AND NOT THE LIGHT OF A FLAME TO READ THE INSTRUCTIONS ON EACH FIREWORK. BE SURE TO USE A TAPER TO LIGHT THE FIREWORK AT ARM'S LENGTH AND STAND WELL BACK FROM THEM. ALWAYS SUPERVISE YOUNG CHILDREN AROUND FIREWORKS.


Happy Diwali

Diwali is India's most important holiday celebrated in October or November each year. Indians celebrate Diwali with family gatherings, glittering diyas, or clay lamps, fireworks, flowers, and worship to Lakshmi, the goddess of wealth. Connect the dots to complete the picture of the goddess.

Diwali Activity Ideas







Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- · Research some interesting facts about Diwali to share: www.natgeokids.com/uk/discover/geography/generalgeography/facts-about-diwali/
- · Talk about the meaning of Diwali Good conquering evil. Think about how this compares to superheros.
- · Discuss other festivals that we celebrate and the things that we do to mark the occasion.
- Work together with friends to clean a room or area to welcome Lakshmi the Hindu goddess of wealth.



Expressive Arts and Design

- · Look at some Rangoli patterns then copy or create, your own using chalk on sandpaper, or outline shapes with glue then sprinkle with lentils, petals, seeds, glitter or coloured sand.
- · Take turns with your friends to draw around each other's feet then cut out the shapes and decorate them to make Lakshmi's footprints.
- · Make a Diya candle holder from clay or playdough

Understanding the World

- · Find India on a globe or a map of the world. This is where the religious festival of Diwali originated from.
- Research what foods are eaten at a traditional Diwali feast. Find a recipe and make a dish or taste some Indian food. Talk about the flavours and what you like or do not like.
- Use the internet to learn more about Hinduism and their Gods.

Communication and Language

- Create a colourful Diwali display that will help to explain what Diwali is to others. Include some Diwali words or phrases.
- Make a storyboard of the story of Diwali.
- · Dress up and act out or make some Diwali puppet characters then use them to retell a Diwali story.
- Draw or colour some Diwali pictures.





Physical Development

- Read the story of Rama and Sita then recreate Sita's trail by threading breads or flowers onto a string.
- Trace over some Rangoli patterns.
- Gather some large items or equipment outdoors (logs, tyres, planks, etc) to build a bridge for Ramo
- Listen and dance to some Hindu music.
- · Play musical chairs to Dhamakedaar Music

Literacy

- · Use the internet to read or listen to stories or watch videos about Diwali: www.greentikki.com/6-short-diwalistories/
- · Visit the library to look at books about Diwali.
- Make a list of Diwali vocabulary.
- Write the names of Diwali characters in alphabetical order.

Mathematics

- · Follow a recipe to make some Diwali treats. Count out, weigh and measure the ingredients correctly and keep track of any cooking times.
- · Use mirrors with Rangoli patterns to understand symmetry. Talk about repeating patterns and all of the shapes that you can see.
- · Find the 5 days of Diwali on a calendar.
